

## CROPS SCHEDULE & WORKFLOW CHECKLIST

- 1. Harvest the Crops Before Withering Begins
  - a. If the field is being used for the next or same rotation, proceed forward with the workflow. Otherwise, the field can remain dormant until the next need of use.
- 2. Cultivate the Field
- 3. Check with the pH Values of the Soil
  - a. If warranted, apply the auto-balanced lime treatment based on what that field will need.
- 4. Check with the Nitrogen Percentage Values for the Soil
  - a. Use the information given, apply the first base of auto-balanced fertilizer for what the field needed.
- 5. Plant the Same or New Seed
  - a. While planting, apply the second base of the auto-balanced fertilizer to bring the field fertilization to 100%.

Oats	4	February 20 <sup>th</sup> to August 1 <sup>st</sup>

		September 10 <sup>th</sup> to November 25 <sup>th</sup>
Corn	6 & 7	March 25 <sup>th</sup> to August 1 <sup>st</sup>

Soybeans	3	May 15 <sup>th</sup> to August 31 <sup>st</sup>
Sorghum	5	May 15 <sup>th</sup> to August 31 <sup>st</sup>
Sugar Cane	4 & 6	August 16 <sup>th</sup> to November 25 <sup>th</sup>
Olives	2	March 10 <sup>th</sup> to November 25 <sup>th</sup>
Carrots	7	October 4 <sup>th</sup> to November 22 <sup>nd</sup>

All field crops <u>must</u> be harvested by December 3<sup>rd</sup>. From December to February going forward, this is a time to bring all machinery in for tune-ups, paint jobs, selling or acquiring new machinery. Additionally, this is a time where we look at our land, our yield output from the past year. Make payments to the bank as necessary, and acquire new fields and change crop assignments for the next year.
